Rumble Strips

Rumble strips, also known as alerts, are raised markers on roadways designed to alert drivers through noise and vibration when they are drifting out of their lane or approaching a hazard. They help reduce accidents by making drivers aware of changes in the road, such as lane boundaries, speed limits, or upcoming hazards.

If you have ever been driving late at night, these little strips may have saved you from great harm. The interesting thing about this part of the road is that if you stay in the lane - you don't even notice that they are there. On a daily drive down the road you wouldn't have reason to think about the importance of this little invention - until you start to drift. The sole purpose of this addition to our highways is to keep you on track.



God's directions for our life should be viewed a bit like a rumble strip as we go through our daily life. As long as we are following God's leading, giving Him control of our life and doing our best to "stay on the road", we don't need as many warnings. However, when we start to move away from His leading and directing, His Word is a rumble strip to get us back on track. And that wandering happens to each of us every single day.

If we have been caught up in gossip, God's "rumble strip" to us would be Ephesians 4:29 which says: "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." If we are letting opportunities pass us by where we could be helping those around us, God's "rumble strip" to guide us would be Hebrews 13:16 which says, "Do not forget to do good and to share with others, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." If we are going through a difficult time and feel like God has abandoned us, His "rumble strip" could come from Isaiah 54:10 which says, "Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet My unfailing love for you will not be shaken nor My covenant of peace be removed," says the Lord, who has compassion on you."

This is why it is critical to daily be in God's word. Reading Scripture gives us the opportunity to know God's direction for our lives, be in tune with His commands and know what comes from Him versus what the world might convince us is right.

Rumble strips may seem like a negative invention - something that is only needed when we run into trouble. However, how amazing is it that creators of our highway systems cared enough about those traveling down the roads that they take the time to install these to keep us safe and on the right road. How much more does our Heavenly Father care about us and our travels here on earth that we stay the course of the Christian walk? And, how important is it that we heed His warnings and daily be following His guidebook - the Bible!!

Next Phase

At the October, 2022 Association Meeting, the OCS school board presented the Association with a two phased building proposal that would add necessary space if we were to continue to grow. The first phase was begun with the addition of 5 classrooms, a second gymnasium and some common areas in the middle school wing. That phase was completed and ready for occupancy by the time our 2023-24 school year began.

During the summer months following that school year, renovation took place throughout the oldest section of our building. Classrooms were updated, bathrooms were expanded and intervention rooms were created. That renovation was finished in time for our 2024-25 school year.



It was anticipated that the second phase would not be needed for a few years, however, God has blessed us greatly with enrollment exceeding our plans and with increased activity of new families hoping to enroll their students this year and beyond. We are again out of space.

As you can see from this picture of our music room, we are trying to fit 70+ students in a space designed for much less. What a blessing to have a strong music program where students want to be part of growing their musical talents - we now need a space to give them the chance to learn.

Work has begun on a final architectural drawing for a phase 2 addition which would add much needed music room spaces, 3 additional classrooms and additional office spaces. The hope is that this addition is ready for the 2026-27 school year.

Through the generosity of so many of our supporters, we move into this second phase planning without debt but with a depleted building fund. The anticipated cost of the second phase is 5 million.

We believe that with your continued partnership, we can make a lasting impact and further our mission of teaching a Biblical Worldview, spreading the Gospel and caring for those we serve today and in the future. 
